Journal Check #1 (week 1) - Vocabulary, Concept Notes, Handouts, Worksheets/Graphic Organizers, WarmUps, Reflections, Sketchbook Prompt Drawings. **post project activities

Journal Check #2 (week 2) - Notes/Handouts, Project Info, Project Thumbnails (at least 3-5), Peer Critique & Summary, Sketchbook Prompt Drawings

**** Post Project Activities** - these are art activities you complete if you finish a project early. The available activities will be announced at the beginning of Week 3. If you finish a project early, then you must keep yourself busy using the time to catch up on missed work as well as complete a post project activity practicing your artistic skills.
